Resolution No. 86-345

A RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE \$27 MILLION COUNTY ROAD IMPROVEMENT LEVY SCHEDULED FOR THE MAY 20, 1986 ELECTION, AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Washington County has numerous existing deficiencies in its major arterial streets transportation system which create serious traffic congestion and safety problems.

WHEREAS, these transportation deficiencies affect the communities quality of life and are a major hindrance to sustained economic development and employment growth in the County.

WHEREAS, the Federal and State governments have committed funding to several major street projects in the County, if the County can provide matching funds.

WHEREAS, projects scheduled that are of a direct benefit to Sherwood include a five lane, \$8.6 million rebuilding of Tualatin-Sherwood Road and Edy Road, and a preliminary "Western Bypass" roadway engineering study budgeted at \$600,000.00.

WHEREAS, passage of the \$27 million County Road Improvement Levy on May 20, 1986, will provide the matching funds necessary to construct these and other County arterial road projects.


NOW THEREFORE THE CITY OF SHERWOOD RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Endorsement. That the passage of the County Road Improvement Levy is strongly supported by the City Council and the voters of the community are urged to seriously consider the significant benefits this Levy will provide to the City of Sherwood and the County as a whole.

Section 2. Transmittal. That the Sherwood City Recorder immediately transmit copies of this Resolution to the Washington County Board of Commissioners and the Councils of neighboring Washington County cities.

Section 3. Effective Date. That this Resolution shall be effective upon passage and adoption.
