Required Resolution: State-Shared Revenue

The State Controller's Division is responsible for certification of eligibility of cities for state-shared revenues (cigarette, liquor and highway taxes) under ORS 221.760.

The law provides that cities located within a county having more than 100,000 inhabitants, according to the most recent decennial census (1990), must provide four or more of the following municipal services to be eligible to receive the revenues:

- Police protection,
- Fire protection,
- Street construction, maintenance, and lighting,
- Sanitary sewers,
- Storm sewers,
- Planning, zoning, & subdivision control,
- One or more utility services.

In order to gain this certification, we will need to have a Resolution from your Council which states that four or more of these services are being provided. A model resolution, applicable to your city under ORS 221.760 is enclosed for your City Council action.

Please return a copy of the Resolution to this office by July 31, 1996, to assure your city's certification. IF YOU ARE NOT CERTIFIED BY JULY 31, 1996, YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE YOUR PORTION OF THE STATE-SHARED REVENUES.

In an effort to improve efficiency and to save time and resources, Statewide Central Disbursements urges your city to join the Local Government Investment Pool at the State Treasury.
