

Resolution No. 2001-955

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROGRAM FOR FY 2001-2002 THROUGH 2006-2007

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Sherwood has developed criteria by which to evaluate and prioritize capital projects, and

Whereas, the Council has reviewed all proposed major capital projects for the next six fiscal years and prioritized them by the criteria, and

Whereas, a comprehensive Capital Improvement Program (CIP) will allow the Council, Staff, and Citizens to better understand and make decisions on the City's capital needs in terms of priorities, scheduling, funding, and budgeting;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> The attached Capital Improvement Program for FY 2001-2002 through 2006-2007, shown here as Exhibit A, is hereby adopted; and

Section 2. The Staff is directed to carry out the CIP; and

<u>Section 3.</u> The Staff is directed to make regular reports to the Council on the status of current capital improvement projects; and

Section 4. The Staff is directed to use the CIP to develop funding strategies and budgets for ensuring years.

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City of Sherwood Capital Improvements Program

The City Council of the City of Sherwood has catagorized and prioritized all capital projects the City is going to undertake in the six years between FY 2001-2002 and 2006-2007. This categorization is based on two sets of factors. Projects are broken down into two categories depending on if the project is an essential or a non-essential service. Projects are also categorized based on the project's merit.

Project merit is determined based on a subjective analysis using three criteria; must, need, and want. Must projects are those requried by law, those for which commitments have been made such as passage of a bond issue, and those in which the City is participating as part of a larger consortium. Need projects are those that are necessary to prevent monitary loss or protect safety, or for which there is a significant committment to the public. Want projects are those that are intended to enhance the City's quality of life, but that do not carry the same urgency as the first two categories. Must projects get a M catagory. Need and Want projects get N and W respectively, plus a 1 and 2 category as described below.

An objective assessment goes into determining if a project is "essential" or "non-essential."

The State of Oregon defines six basic municipal services. In order to be recognized by the State, a city must certify annually that it performs at least four of these services. These include Police, Fire Protection, Water, Sewer, Streets, and Planning.

The Sherwood City Council defines "Essential Services" as the six basic services proscribed by the State, plus Library, Parks, and Building Code Administration. When potential capital projects are analyzed, if they are one of these nine Essential Services, they get a "1" category.

There are five other services Cities often provide: Recreation, Community Events, Arts, Social Services, and Communication. These are catagorized by the City Council as "Non-Essential Services." When Non-Essential Projects are proposed they are given a "2" category.
