

## Resolution 2004-015

## A RESOLUTION DECLARING APRIL 5, 2004 THROUGH APRIL 10, 2004 "COURT AMNESTY WEEK."

WHEREAS, Municipal Court has a backlog of cases in which the defendant's driver's license has been suspended and/or the account has been turned over to a collection agency;

WHEREAS, City staff need to complete the conversion of paper files and cases on the old computer software to the Full Court software installed in May 2002;

WHEREAS, resolving the backlog would save staff time and expense in inputting and monitoring cases which cannot be resolved, while providing an opportunity for defendants to expeditiously resolve overdue fines;

WHEREAS, a Court Amnesty Week could resolve the backlog; and

WHEREAS, the following conditions would apply:

- Cases eligible for amnesty are those where the defendant's drivers license has been suspended and/or the account has been turned over to a collection agency
- The entire balance owing must be paid during the amnesty week, April 5 to April 10, 2004
- The Court will accept fifty cents per one dollar due in fines.
- This is a one time event. After 3 p.m. on April 10, 2004 all fines will revert back to the assessed amount.

## NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF SHERWOOD RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. April 5 through April 10, 2004 is declared "Court Amnesty Week." Defendants meeting the conditions specified will have their driver's license suspensions cleared.

Section 2: This Resolution shall be effective upon its approval and adoption.
