AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE KINDLING OF FIRE ON
CERTAIN STREETS.

The People of the Town of Sherwood do Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons or corporations, either by him or themselves, or his or their agents or employees to cause any fire to be kindled on, in and about the streets, alleys and byways of Blocks 1, 2, and 3, in the Town of Sherwood, unless a special permit in writing be first obtained from the Mayor or Marshall.

(PENALTY).

Section 2. Any violation or failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance by any person, persons or corporations, upon conviction thereof before the town court, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00.

(EMERGENCY).

Section 3. Whereas, there is an immediate necessity that this ordinance shall take effect upon its approval by the Mayor, an emergency is hereby declared and said ordinance is hereby declared to be necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, peace and safety of the people of the Town of Sherwood for the following reasons:

That the said Town of Sherwood is at present without any ordinance pertaining to the kindling of fire on certain streets; that such ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the safety of the town in that fires are being kindled on

said streets, thereby endangering public and private property.

THEREFORE, This ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its approval by the President of the Council.
