O R D I N A N C E No. 27

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE TAKING AND KILLING OF DOGS.

THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN OF SHERWOOD DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

S E C T I O N 1.

That no dog shall be permitted to go abroad in any streets, squares, lanes, alleys or other places of the town, without the owner thereof shall first procure from the City Treasurer, a license for each dog, as in this ordinance provided.

S E C T I O N II.

That the owner or person having in charge any dog or dogs permitted to run at large within the corporate limits of the town, shall take out a license for such dog or dogs, by paying into the Town Treasurer the sum of One Dollar for each male dog and the sum of Three Dollars for each female dog, which payment shall entitle him to a receipt from the treasurer, designating the owner's name and the number of the license, and a license tag bearing the same number as the number on receipt.

S E C T I O N III.

If said license shall not be paid within thirty days after it has become due, it shall be the duty of the Town Marshal to seize, kill and properly bury any and all dogs found running at large in violation of section one of this ordinance. Provided, that when a dog has been taken up, the marshal shall notify the owner or representative thereof who within twenty four hours from such notice may thereupon recover possession of said dog upon payment of the license to the Treasurer, and a fee of two dollars to the Marshal which shall be retained by him for serving notice and taking care of the dog.

S E C T I O N VI.

No license shall be issued for a less period than one year, and shall expire on the thirty first day of December each year, and shall become delinquent thirty days after such expiration.

S E C T I O N V.

That ordinance number thirteen pertaining to taxing and killing dogs is deemed to be inadequate, and does not subserve the best interests of the citizens of the town of Sherwood, it is hereby declared that an emergency exists, and that this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and its approval by the President.

S E C T I O N VI.

That Ordinance number Thirteen, and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance is, and the same is hereby repealed.
