ORDINANCENo 43

An ordinance regulating the time, and conducting the diperation of rooms or buildings where billiards, pool and cards are played.

ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS THE PROPLE OF THE TOWN OF SHERWOOD DO

SECTION 1.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, company or corporation conducting a public room or building within the corporate limits of the Town of Sherwood, where billiards, pool or cards are being played, to permit any person under the age of twenty-one years to play such games therein, or to visit or frequent the room or building wherein such games are played.

SFCTION 11.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, company or corporation conducting a room or building where billiards, pool and cards are play to allow such games to be played between the hours of 12:00 6 10:05 PrM.Saturday, and 5:00 c'clock A.M. Monday.

SFCTION 111.

All rooms and buildings within the corporate limits of the Town of Sherwood, where billiards, pool and cards, or other games are bling played, shall have clear glass in the windows and doors next the street, and the lower portion of said glass shall commence at a point in said window or door not greater in height than five feet above the surface of the sidewalk in front of such room or building. And such glass at all times shall remain free from screens of any nature, so as not to obstruct a clear view of the interior of such room or building by persons passing along the walk in front of said building.

FOTION 1V.

Any person, firm, company or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished upon conviction before the town Recorder, by a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$50.00 dollars, and in case of default of payment of such fine, by imprisonment in the town jail not less than 5 days, nor more than 25 days. The council also reserves the right to revoke the license of the proprietor of any billiard, pool and card room when it deems it expedient and for the lest interests of the town.

SECTION V.

That the Town of Sherwood is without any ordinance pertaining to the regulating and conducting of rooms and buildings where billiards, pool and cards are being played, it is deemed an emergency exists, and that this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force upon its passage by the council, and approval by the Mayor.
