ORDINANCE No. 67.

An Ordinance for making street improvements on Railroad Street, in the City of Sherwood, Oregon, from the southwesterly line of Pine Street to the southwesterly line of Main Street (extended southeasterly) and including the intersection at Washington Street, prescribing the character of materials to be used, providing that the costs and expenses of said improvement be assessed against the property benefitted thereby, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Sherwood does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Railroad Street, in the City of Sherwood, Oregon be improved from the southwesterly line of Pine Street to the southwesterly line of Main Street (extended southeasterly) and including the intersection at Washington Street, by bringing the surface of said street to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway with portland cement concrete pavement 23 feet wide and of an approximate thickness of six inches, providing suitable drainage, and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement.

Section 2. That the cost and expense of such improvement work be assessed against the lots, tracts or parcels of land abutting upon that part of Railroad Street so improved and upon the lots, tracts or parcels of land liable for improvement of said street intersections, and that such work be done in the manner prescribed in this ordinance and as provided by the charter of said City.

Section 3. That the City Engineer of said City be and he is hereby directed to estimate the whole expense of said improvement, as prescribed by the Charter of said City, and to report such estimate to this City Council.

Section 4. Inasmuch as the above mentioned street improvement is necessary for the public convenience, health, peace and safety of said City, and it is necessary that the same be done without delay, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Mayor.
