

ORDINANCE N o . 78 . . .

An Ordinance for making street improvements on Pine Street, in the City of Sherwood, Oregon, from the southeasterly line of of 3rd Street to the northwesterly line of the right-of-way of the S. P. Railroad, together with all street intersections included in said street improvement, prescribing the character of materials to be used, providing that the costs and expenses of said improvement be assessed against the property benefitted thereby, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Sherwood does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Pine Street, in the City of Sherwood, Oregon, be improved from the southeasterly line of 3rd Street to the northwesterly line of the right-of-way of the S.P. Railroad by bringing the surface of said street to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway with portland cement concrete pavement 20 feet wide and of an approximate thickness of six inches, including the paving of all street intersections along the line of said street improvement, providing suitable drainage, and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement.

Section 2. That the cost and expense of such improvement work be assessed against the lots, tracts or parcels of land abutting upon that part of ~~Sherwood~~ Pine Street so improved, and that such work be done in the manner prescribed in this ordinance and as provided by the charter of said City.

Section 3. That the City Engineer of said City be and he is hereby directed to estimate the whole cost and expense of said street improvement, as prescribed by the charter of said City, and to report such estimate to this City Council.

Section 4. Inasmuch as the above mentioned street improvement is necessary for the public convenience, health, peace and safety of said City, and it is necessary that the same be done without delay, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Mayor.
