

**ORDINANCE No. 91**

An ordinance to repeal Ordinance No. 82 of the City of Sherwood, Oregon, which said ordinance assesses upon each lot, tract or parcel of land abutting upon Washington Street, in said City, from the southeasterly line of First Street to the northwesterly line of Railroad Street, its apportionate share of the costs and expenses of the improvement of said portion of Washington Street, setting aside the apportionment of said costs and expenses of said improvement, and declaring an emergency.

**THE CITY OF SHERWOOD DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. That ordinance No. 82 of the City of Sherwood, Oregon, entitled "An ordinance declaring and assessing upon each lot, tract or parcel of land abutting upon Washington Street, in the City of Sherwood, Oregon, from the southeasterly line of First Street to the northwesterly line of Railroad Street, its proportionate share of the costs and expenses of the improvement of said portion of Washington Street, as provided by Ordinance No. 82 of said City, entitled "An ordinance for making street improvements on Washington Street, in the City of Sherwood, Oregon, from the southeasterly line of First Street to the northwesterly line of Railroad Street, prescribing the character of materials to be used, providing that the costs and expenses of said improvement be assessed against the property benefitted thereby, and declaring an emergency", passed by the council of said City and approved by the Mayor thereof on July 27, 1925, and directing that the said assessed cost be entered in the Docket of City Liens of said City, as provided by the Charter of said City, and declaring an emergency", passed by the City Council of said City, and approved by the Mayor thereof, on September 28, 1925, be and is hereby repealed.

Section 2. That the apportionment of the costs and expenses of the said street improvement describes in Section 1 of this Ordinance, and which was made by this City Council on September 5, 1925, be and is hereby repealed.

Section 3. Inasmuch as it is important that the aforesaid apportionment and assessment be set aside and repealed in order that the improvement of said street be completed before the rainy season sets in, and it is necessary for the convenience, welfare, peace and safety of said City, that the same be done without delay, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect upon its approval by the Mayor.
