

ORDINANCE NO 12.

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE WORKING OF TOWN PRISONERS.

The People of the Town of Sherwood do Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. That hereafter all town prisoners, during the term of their imprisonment or committment, after conviction, shall be liable to work upon the public streets, crossings, lots, blocks, sewers, or upon any other property of the city, or property over which the city has control.

Section 2. The town prisoners must work as herein provided, under the direction of the town marshall, whose duty it shall be to see that the prisoners are guarded to prevent escape and, if necessary, he may shackle them.

Section 3. This ordinance shall not be construed to require any female to perform such work, nor to require any prisoner to labor more than ten hours in any one day, and said prisoner shall not work on Sunday. The term, "Town Prisoners", as used in this ordinance, shall be construed to include all persons who may be hereafter sentenced to imprisonment for the violation of any ordinance of the Town of Sherwood, or committed to prison for the non-payment of any fine imposed for the violation of such ordinances, and not otherwise.
