

ORDINANCE NO. 15.

AN ORDINANCE PERSCRIBING THE TIME FOR HOLDING PRIMARY
NOMINATING ASSEMBLIES.

The People of the Town of Sherwood do Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. On or before the 30th day preceding any election, at which municipal officers of the Town of Sherwood are to be elected, direct primary nominating assemblies shall be held at such time and place as the Common Council may direct. PROVIDED HOWEVER, that the said day above mentioned shall not be later than the 30th day preceding such election.

Section 2. That the said several nominating assemblies shall be presided over by a Chairman Pro Tem appointed by the Council, and when said assemblies shall be called to order, the said Chairman Pro Tem shall call for a nomination for a Chairman for said assembly, to preside at the nominations of the officers to be elected. The votes for said Chairman shall be vive Voce.

Section 3. That the nominees for all offices shall be nominated vive voce and voted upon by written ballots and the candidates receiving the largest number of votes at said primary nominating assemblies shall be adjudged nominated and shall be the candidates to be voted upon at said ensuing election. PROVIDED HOWEVER, that nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed so that the several parties holding said primary nominating assemblies may have the name of more than one candidate for each office placed upon the ballot to be vote upon at said ensuing election but that each party holding said primary nominating assembly shall be entitled to one candidate for each office.
