ORDINANCE No. 24

An Ordinance licensing certain business and employment in the Town of Sherwood and regulating the manner of issuing licenses.

The people of the Town of Sherwood do ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or joint stock company to engage in or carry on any of the business, trade or employment designated in this ordinance within the Town of Sherwood without first obtaining a license to do so.

Section 2. That every person, firm, corporation or company required by any ordinance to obtain a license to engage in any trade, business or profession for which a license is required shall pay to the Town Treasurer the sum or sums required by ordinance to be paid therefor; thereupon, with the receipt of the Town Treasurer (which receipt shall set forth the kind of business for which license is desired), they shall apply to the Recorder of the Town of Sherwood, who shall issue the license to the parties applying in accordance with the receipt of the Treasurer.

Section 3. That in every license to be taken out under and by virtue of this ordinance, shall be contained and set forth the purpose, trade, business or profession for which such license is granted, and the name and place of business of the person or persons taking out the same; and said license shall authorize the continuance of the business named therein at the place named therein for the term of such license.

Section 4. Any person, firm, company or corporation

WHO SHALL maintain and conduct what is commonly known as a Poolhall or a Billiardhall within the Town of Sherwood shall pay a license according to the number of Pool or Billiard tables belonging to or used in the building or place to be licensed.

For each and every table contained in said pool or billiard hall the keeper thereof shall pay an annual license fee of Ten Dollars (\$ 10.00), payable quarterly in advance.

Every place where Pool or Billiard is played when a charge is made by the owner or the proprietor thereof to persons playing Pool or Billiard shall be regarded as a Pool or Billiard Hall Under this Ordinance.

Section 5. Any person, firm, company or corporation who shall maintain and conduct any place of business within the Town of Sherwood and maintain therein tables used for card-playing shall pay an annual license fee of (\$25.00) Twenty-five Dollars, payable quarterly in advance, for each table used and maintained therein for card playing.

Section 6. Any person, firm, company or corporation who shall maintain and operate what is known as a Dray for hauling and moving within the Town of Sherwood shall pay an annual license fee of Ten(\$10.00) Dollars . payable Semi-annually, for each and every Dray.

SECTION 7. Section as amended
Any person, firm, company or corporation who shall maintain or conduct any public dance or dance hall within the Town of Sherwood, shall pay a quarterly license fee of twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) in advance for each and every of said public dance or dance halls maintained.

Picture Shows and Vaudaville Shows.

Section 8. Any person, firm, company or corporation who shall maintain or conduct any Picture Shows and Vaudaville Shows within the Town of Sherwood shall pay an annual license fee of Twenty-five(\$25.00) Dollars for such Picture Shows and Vaudaville Shows.

Section 9. Every manager or proprietor of every traveling show or circus visiting the Town of Sherwood for the purpose of giving performance shall pay a license fee of (\$~~2.50~~ two \times $\frac{50}{10}$) per day.

Section 10. Any person, firm, company or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof before the Town Court, be punished by a fine of not less than (\$10.00) Ten Dollars, nor more than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars or by imprisonment of not to exceed 25 days, or both.

Section 11. Whereas, This Ordinance and its passage are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the Town of Sherwood and its inhabitants, in that by reason of a certain law enacted terminating certain business the loss of revenue from which will leave insufficient funds with which to conduct the business affairs of the said Town of Sherwood.
