AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE BOND AND SALARY OF AND PRESCRIBING THE DUTIES OF TOWN MARSHAL.

THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN OF SHERWOOD DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

S E C T I O N 1

The Town Marshal shall exercise a vigilant care over the peace and quiet of the Town, and shall see that the ordinances and other rules and regulations of the town are strictly observed and enforced. He shall have charge of the Council Chamber and keep the same in good order, and attend regularly on the meetings of the Common Council and the sittings of the Recorder's court. He shall be keeper of the town prison and shall furnish each prisoner confined therein with suitable food, care and attention. He shall be ex-officio tax collector of the town, and shall, as collector, enforce the collection of all taxes as may be prescribed by ordinances, and turn the same over to the Town Treasurer, taking his duplicate receipt thereof, one of which shall be filed with the Recorder. He shall perform such other and further duties as are required of him by the charter or ordinances of the town.

S E C T I O N 111

Before entering upon the duties of his office, the marshal shall give a bond, with two good and sufficient sureties, in the sum of five hundred dollars, (\$500.00), for the faithful performance of his duties and that he will pay over all moneys as required by law, and at the expiration of his term of office, turn over to his successor any and all other property that may have come into his hands by virtue of said office.

S E C T I O N 111

The Town Marshal shall receive for his services the sum of ten dollars per month, payable monthly. He shall also be entitled to the same fees as are now or may be provided by law for constables in the State of Oregon. He shall be allowed the sum of one dollar per day for each prisoner while in his custody, which amount shall be in full for his fees as jailor and board and care of such prisoner.

S E C T I O N 1V

Inasmuch as there is no existing ordinance relating to the Town Marshal, it is hereby declared an emergency exists, and that this ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage by the Common Council, and its approval by the Mayor.
