ORDINANCE No. 40.

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE TAXING AND KILLING OF DOGS.

THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN OF SHERWOOD DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I.

It shall be unlawful from and after the passage and adoption of this ordinance, and its approval by the Mayor, for any person firm or corporation being the owner or custodian of any dog, to permit any such dog to run loose or be at large upon any of the public streets, highways or other public places within the corporate limits of the Town of Sherwood, without first having procured from the Town Treasurer, a license for each dog, as in this ordinance provided.

SECTION II.

That the owner or person having in charge any dog or dogs permitted to run at large within the corporate limits of the town, shall take out a license for such dog or dogs, by paying into the Town Treasurer the sum of \$5⁰⁰ for each male dog and the sum of \$10⁰⁰ for each female dog, which payment shall entitle him to a receipt from the Treasurer, designating the owner's name and number of the license, and a license tag bearing the same number as the number on the receipt.

SECTION III.

If said license shall not be paid within thirty days after it has become due, it shall be the duty of the Town Marshal to seize, kill and properly bury any and all dogs found running at large in violation of section one of this ordinance. Provided, that when a dog has been taken up, the Marshal shall notify the owner or representative thereof who within twenty four hours from such notice may thereupon recover possession of said dog upon payment of the license fee to the Treasurer, and a fee of two dollars \$2.00 to the Marshal which shall be retained by him for serving notice and taking care of the dog.

SECTION VI.

No license shall be issued for a less period than one year, and shall expire on the thirty first day of December each year, and shall become delinquent thirty days after such expiration.

SECTION V.

That ordinance No. 27 pertaining to taxing and killing of dogs is deemed to be inadequate, and does not subserve the best interests of the inhabitants of the Town of Sherwood, this ordinance shall be and become effective upon its passage and adoption by the Council, and approval by the Mayor of the Town of Sherwood.

SECTION VI.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance is and the same are hereby repealed
