

ORDINANCE NO. 519

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE NUMBERING OF RESIDENCES AND OTHER PLACES OF OCCUPANCY IN THE CITY OF SHERWOOD; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF SHERWOOD DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there be and hereby is established a numbering system for all houses, stores and other buildings (except sheds and outbuildings) erected or to be erected within the corporate limits of the city of Sherwood, in accordance with the numbering system established by the common council of the city of Sherwood.

Section 2. That all residents, occupants, or owners shall hereafter affix the number assigned by said city recorder and council to the exterior of said residence or place of occupancy in a place readily visible to the public.

Section 3. That the cost of the numbers to be affixed to the house or building shall be borne by the owner of the house or building.

Section 4. That all numbers used in displaying the assigned number shall be in accordance with specifications established by the common council or said city. That a list of such specifications shall be made in the office of the city recorder, and shall be established by the common council by motion.

Section 5. That no person shall alter, deface, obscure or remove any number assigned and placed under the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 6. That no owner shall use a number other than the one assigned to him by the city.

Section 7. That any resident, occupant, or owner failing to affix an approved number in accordance with the terms of this ordinance within 30 days after being notified by an authorized official of the city of Sherwood to affix such number, shall be deemed in violation of this Ordinance.

Section 8. That any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than \$2.00 or more than \$10.00, plus cost of prosecution.

Section 9. The common council deems it to be necessary for the peace and safety and general welfare of the people of the city and for an orderly and accurate accounting for a collection of rentals for water service within the city, that this ordinance take effect immediately after its passage and approval by the mayor, and it is hereby declared so to be effective.
