ORDINANCE NO. 520

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND LIMITING SEWER SERVICE; PRESCRIBING A CHARGE FOR EACH CONNECTION MADE TO THE CITY SEWER SYSTEM WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SHERWOOD, OREGON; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF SHERWOOD, OREGON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1

- It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to make or cause to be made any connection to the sewer system of the City of Sherwood, Oregon, with premises situated outside the corporate limits of the City.
- (b) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to make any connection to the sewer system of the City of Sherwood without first obtaining a permit from the City after submitting an application giving the name of the owner of the property, the number of the lot and block, name of the street and house number. If the application is approved by the City, a permit will be issued. All service connection fees and charges shall be paid for at amounts and rates fixed by this ordinance and shall be paid at the time of application. Upon the issuance of the permit, the City shall make the necessary connection.
- A fee of \$100.00 for each connection within the corporate limits of the City shall be paid prior to the issuance of a permit. There shall be allowed, however, a credit against such charge in lieu of the monthly service payments heretofor made by the applicant, or owner of such premises, for sewer service not rendered by the City. In no case, however, shall such credit exceed the sum of \$100.00; such sum to be credited to the individual dwelling or other structure which was in existence and situated upon the specific premises as of May 1, 1961, and upon which a sewer service charge had been made.

Section 2

All ordinances and parts of ordinances of previous date insofar as the same are in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed and annulled.

Section 3

Whereas it is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the City of Sherwood that the rate schedule hereinabove set forth be placed in affect at once to provide funds wherewith to discharge the City's obligations, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the common Council, and approval of the Mayor.
