ORDINANCE NO. 629

ORDINANCE SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER VIII, PARKING REGULATIONS OF ORDINANCE #599, "MOTOR VEHICLE CODE OF THE CITY OF SHERWOOD" BY ADDING PROVISIONS DESIGNATING NO PARKING AREAS, REPEALING ORDINANCE #561, AND PRESCRIBING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF SHERWOOD DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Ordinance #599, Chapter VIII, "Parking Regulations" is hereby amended and supplemented by adding thereto the following sections:

"Section 8: No person shall park or leave standing a motor vehicle of any kind or character, whether motorized or not, as follows:

- (a) Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.
- (b) Within any portion of a cross-walk.
- (c) Within any area marked as a loading zone other than for the purpose of loading or unloading cargo.

"Section 9: No person shall park a motor vehicle of any kind, whether motorized or not, on the following designated portions of the following public streets, except as may be necessitated by an emergency:

(a) At any time

(1) On the southeasterly side of 1st Street from the intersection of 1st Street with Park Street to the intersection of 1st Street with Main Street;

(2) On the west side of North Sherwood Boulevard from the intersection of North Sherwood Boulevard with Gleneagle Drive to the intersection of North Sherwood Boulevard with Third Street;

(3) On the southwesterly side of Gleneagle Drive from the intersection of Gleneagle Drive with Southwest Pacific Highway to the intersection of Gleneagle Drive with North Sherwood Boulevard;

(4) On the northeast side of Northwest Park Street from the intersection of Northwest Park Street with Southwest First Street to the intersection of Northwest Park Street and Railroad Street.

~~(b) Between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon on Sundays on the easterly side of Main Street from the intersection of Main Street and Second Street to the intersection of Main Street and Third Street;~~

(B) Between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on Monday through Saturday in excess of two hours continuously in any one location on any City street outside of a residential district as defined by Subsection 1 of Section 483.020, Oregon Revised Statutes.

"Section 10: (Section 221.340 ORS) Parking Ordinance Violation - Mode of Charging Defendant - Notice as Complaint.

(1) In all prosecutions for violation of motor vehicle parking ordinances in the City of Sherwood, it shall be sufficient to charge the defendant by an unsworn written notice if the same clearly states:

- (a) The date, place, and nature of the charge.
- (b) The time and place for defendant's appearance in court;
- (c) The name of the arresting officer;
- (d) The license number of the vehicle.

(2) The notice provided for in Subsection (1) of this section shall either be delivered to the defendant or placed in a conspicuous place upon the vehicle involved in the violation. The notice shall serve as the complaint in this case. In all other respects the procedure now provided by law in such cases shall be followed.

Section 2: Section 30 of Ordinance 599, Chapter VIII is amended to read as follows:

"Section 30: Penalties.

(a) With respect to the following designated violations of the parking provisions of this ordinance, if the cash bail hereinafter designated be paid within the times hereinafter stated, no further appearance or penalty will be imposed, and such bail shall be applied in full as a fine for the violation:

(b) Any violation of the provisions of this ordinance for which bail is not posted in the amounts and within the time prescribed in Subsection (a) hereof shall, upon conviction, be punishable by a fine of not more than \$50.00 for each violation."

Section 3: Ordinance 561 enacted October 11, 1967, is hereby repealed.

Section 4: This ordinance shall be effective on the 31st day after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
