ORDINANCE NO. 86-849

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL CITY ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF SHERWOOD, OREGON NOVEMBER 4, 1986, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE STATEWIDE GENERAL ELECTION, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF SHERWOOD, OREGON THE QUESTION OF ESTABLISHING A NEW TAX BASE, PURSUANT TO SECTION 11, ARTICLE XI OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF OREGON

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WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Sherwood finds that the presently existing tax base provides insufficient funds to properly operate the essential functions of city government and that there should be submitted to the legal voters of the city the question of establishing a new tax base in accordance with the provisions of Section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Constitution and the laws of the State of Oregon, it is necessary to submit the question of establishing a new tax base to the legal voters of the City of Sherwood only at a primary or general election in even numbered years, and that Council finds that the general election to be held on November 4, 1986, is the appropriate time to submit said question;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF SHERWOOD DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: It is necessary and in the best interest of the people of the City of Sherwood that there be submitted to the legal voters of the city at the regular statewide general election to be held throughout the state, including all voting precincts within the city, on November 4, 1986, the proposition hereinafter stated in accordance with Section 11, Article XI, Constitution of the State of Oregon.

Section 2: At the city tax base election there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Sherwood for their approval or rejection the following measure:

"SHALL THE CITY OF SHERWOOD LEVY A \$375,000 TAX BASE BEGINNING WITH THE 1987-88 FISCAL YEAR?"

Explanation

Measure, if approved, will establish new city tax base effective July 1, 1987. Purpose is to provide sufficient funds to operate essential City functions. Approval authorizes

levy up to \$375,000 for 1987-88 fiscal year without additional election. Tax base for 1986-87 fiscal year is \$216,751.00. If approved, last year of 2-year library serial levy will be eliminated. If measure is not approved second year of existing library serial levy will be levied.

Approval of new tax base would result in maximum estimated rate of \$ 4.59 per \$1,000 assessed value. Rate is \$ 3.41 per \$1,000 of assessed value this year. The Oregon constitution allows 6% annual increase of base without voter approval. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of estimate.

Section 3: The foregoing proposition shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Sherwood by ballot at each precinct or part thereof within the City of Sherwood at the general election of November 4, 1986.

Section 4: Notice of the city tax base election shall be given in the form substantially as hereinafter set forth, by posting notices substantially in the following form at each of the herein designated places, such posting to be accomplished not later than October 23, 1986.

Places of posting conspicuously exposed to public view in the City of Sherwood:

1. At the front door of the City Hall
2. At the front door of the United States Post Office
3. At the front door of the Tualatin Rural Fire Protection District Station
4. In at least one other public place to be selected by the City Recorder

The form of notice shall be substantially as follows:

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to Ordinance No. 86-849 enacted by the City Council of Sherwood, Oregon on September 12, 1986, there will be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Sherwood for their approval or rejection, at the general election to be held on November 4, 1986, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock A.M. and 8:00 o'clock P.M., the following proposition:

Explanation

Measure, if approved, will establish new city tax base effective July 1, 1987. Purpose is to provide sufficient funds to properly operate essential city functions. Section 5: If the tax base measure submitted pursuant to the foregoing sections of this ordinance is approved the second year of the two year library serial levy approved by the voters at August 12, 1986 special election shall not be levied. If not approved the second year of the 2-year library serial levy shall be levied.

Section 6: The City Recorder be and she is hereby authorized and directed to cause the county elections officer to have prepared ballots in due and legal form as herein prescribed and to take any and all other and further actions necessary to conduct the election in accordance with the laws regulating and governing elections.

Section 7: It is necessary for the orderly conduct of the election and to comply with the statutory time requirements for submitting election information to the county elections officer prior to the sixty-first day previous to the general election date and therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist. This ordinance shall therefore be effective upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
