

Sherwood, Ore., June 17, 1925.

A called meeting of the Council was held, Mayor Morback presiding. On roll call Councilmen Snyder, Lawrenz, Young and Swope were present.

A communication from the Tualatin Valley Electric Co. regarding a new contract for street lighting was read and discussed.

Ordinance No. 63, authorizing the Mayor and Recorder of the City of Sherwood, on behalf of the City, to enter into a contract with the Tualatin Valley Electric Co. for the supplying and furnishing of electric lights and service for the said City of Sherwood and declaring an emergency, was then introduced and upon motion, duly seconded, the ordinance was ordered read the first time. Motion carried. Ayes; Snyder, Lawrenz, Young and Swope. Nays; None. The ordinance was then read. Upon motion, duly seconded the ordinance was ordered read the second time. The motion carried. Ayes; Snyder, Lawrenz, Young and Swope. Nays; None. The ordinance was then so read. Upon motion duly made and seconded the ordinance was ordered read in full the third time. Motion carried, Ayes; Snyder, Lawrenz, Young and Swope. Nays; None. The ordinance was then declared passed.

A communication was then read from the Tualatin Valley Electric Co. offering to install a deep well pump at the City's present well site and attaching a bid thereto. After discussion a motion was made by Snyder and seconded by Lawrenz that the City accept the bid of the Tualatin Valley Co. for immediate installation of the pump. Motion was put and Snyder, Young, Lawrenz and Swope voted Aye. Nays; None.

A motion was then made by Snyder that the Mayor and Water Superintendent be authorized to inspect and cause to be repaired replaced or installed all material necessary to putting the water mains or hydrants in the proposed cement paving district in first class shape before the commencement of said paving. Seconded and carried, all voting Aye.

Moved by Swope that new planking be ordered for the Bridge over Cedar Creek on the extension of Washington St. road. Seconded voted and carried, all voting Aye.

No further business appearing the Council Adjourned subject to the call of the Mayor.
