

Sherwood, Ore., July 10, 1925

The City Council met pursuant to adjournment on call of Mayor Morback. On roll call all members of the council were found to be present.

This meeting being called for the purpose of considering the various street improvement petitions before the council, that matter was taken up.

The following resolution was then introduced and read:-

Resolution of intention to improve.

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Sherwood, Washington County, Oregon, deems it expedient and purposes to improve Railroad Street, in said City from the southwesterly line of Pine Street, to the southwesterly line of Main Street, (extended southeasterly) and intersection at Washington Street, such improvement to be made and done in the following manner, to wit:

By bringing the surface of said Railroad Street to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway with portland cement concrete pavement 23 feet wide and of an approximate thickness of six inches, providing suitable drainage, and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement, said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of said City, and at an estimated cost of \$5334.00.

But if the owners of 75% of the property affected by this improvement, and upon which assessments will be levied to pay for the same, shall, by petition presented to the City Council before the adoption of an ordinance declaring the same, agree upon a different kind of an improvement, the estimate of the cost thereof and the specifications of the same shall be made upon the basis of the character of the improvement so selected, and the City Council reserves the right to designate a different kind of an improvement, if the property owners so direct, as above specified.

That written objections and remonstrances to said proposed improvement may be made and filed withwith- the Recorder of said City, at any time before 3 o'clock P. M. on July 27th, 1925.

Upon motion duly made, seconded, and unanimously carried, the foregoing resolution was adopted, and the Recorder was authorized to cause the resolution to be printed, posted and published according to the requirements of the City Charter.

The following resolution was then introduced and read:-

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE.

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Sherwood, Washington County, Oregon, deems it expedient and purposes to improve Washington Street, in said City, from the southeasterly line of First Street to the northwesterly line of Railroad Street, such improvement to be made and done in the following manner, to wit:

By bringing the surface of said portion of said street to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway with portland cement concrete pavement 42 feet 3 inches wide and of an approximate thickness of six inches laying and constructing concrete curb (except where curb is already constructed) driveways, concrete cornerstones at driveways, providing suitable drainage, and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement, said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of said City, and at an estimated cost of \$4533.00.

But if the owners of 75% of the property affected by this improvement, and upon which assessments will be levied to pay for the same, shall, by petition presented to the City Council before the adoption of an ordinance declaring the same, agree upon a different kind of an improvement, the estimate of the cost thereof and the specifications of the same shall be made upon the basis of the character of the improvement so selected, and the City Council reserves the right to designate a different kind of an improvement, if the property owners so direct as above specified.

That written objections and remonstrances to said proposed improvement may be made and filed with the Recorder of said City at any time before 3 o'clock P. M. on July 27th, 1925.

A motion was then made and seconded that the resolution be adopted. The motion unanimously carried and the resolution was so declared and the Recorder was authorized to cause the resolution to be

posted, printed and published according to the requirements of the City Charter.

The following resolution was then introduced and read:-

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE.

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Sherwood, Washington County, Oregon, deems it expedient and purposes to improve Main Street from the northwesterly line of Railroad Street to the northwesterly line of First Street, and also First Street from the northeasterly line of Main Street to the southwesterly line of Pine Street, with full intersection at said Main and First Streets and said First Street and Washington Street, all in said City, such improvement to constitute one connected and continuous improvement, and to be made and done in the following manner to wit:-

By bringing the surface of said portions of said streets to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway with portland cement concrete pavement 44 feet wide and of an approximate thickness of six inches, paving said street intersections with said concrete pavement of same thickness, laying and constructing concrete curb (except where curb is already constructed), driveways, concrete cornerstones at driveways, providing suitable drainage and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement, said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of said City, and at an estimated cost of \$9488.00.

But if the owners of 75% of the property affected by this improvement, and upon which assessments will be levied to pay for the same, shall, by petition presented to the City Council before the adoption of an ordinance declaring the same, agree upon a different kind of an improvement, the estimate of the cost thereof and the specifications of the same shall be made upon the basis of the character of the improvement so selected, and the City Council reserves the right to designate a different kind of an improvement if the property owners so direct, as above specified.

That written objections and remonstrances to said proposed improvement may be made and filed with the recorder of said City at any time before 8 o'clock P. M. on July 27th, 1925.

A motion was made and duly seconded that the resolution be adopted. The motion carried unanimously and the resolution was thereupon declared adopted. The recorder was authorized to cause the resolution to be posted, printed and published according to the requirements of the City Charter.

The following resolution was then introduced and read:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE.

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Sherwood, Washington County, Oregon, deems it expedient and purposes to improve the street extending north and south between Blocks 1 and 2 on the west and Blocks 3 and 5 on the east, all in Sherwood Acres, in said City of Sherwood, Oregon, said improvement to begin at the north end of said street at the southerly line of the county road extending along the northwesterly side of said Blocks 2 and 3, and to extend to the end of said street at the south boundary of said Sherwood acres, such improvement to be made and done in the following manner, to wit:-

By bringing the surface of said street to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway with macadam pavement 34 feet wide, and of an approximate thickness of 0.5 feet, providing suitable drainage, and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement, said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of said City, and at an estimated cost of \$1100.00.

But if the owners of 75% of the property affected by this improvement, and upon which assessments will be levied to pay for the same, shall, by petition presented to the City Council before the adoption of an ordinance declaring the same, agree upon a different kind of an improvement, the estimate of the cost thereof and the specifications of the same shall be made upon the basis of the character of the improvement so selected, and the City Council reserves the right to designate a different kind of an improvement if the property owners so direct, as above specified.

That written remonstrances and objections to said proposed improvement may be made and filed with the Recorder of said City at any time before 8 o'clock P. M. on July 27th, 1925.

A motion was made and duly seconded that the resolution be adopted. The motion carried unanimously and the resolution was thereupon declared adopted and the Recorder was authorized to cause the resolution to be

posted, printed and published, according to the requirements of the City Charter.

The following resolution was then introduced and read:-
Motion

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE.

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Sherwood, Washington County, Oregon, deems it expedient and purposes to improve First Street in Smock Addition to Sherwood, Oregon, from the northeasterly line of Pine Street (said line being the southwesterly line of said addition) to the southwesterly line of Charles Young's tract of land, all in the City of Sherwood, Oregon, such improvement to be made and done in the following manner, to wit:-

By bringing the surface of said portion of First Street to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway with gravel surfacing pavement 16 feet wide and of a suitable thickness, providing suitable drainage, and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement, said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of said City, and at an estimated cost of \$1000.00.

But if the owners of 75% of the property affected by this improvement, and upon which assessments will be levied to pay for the same, shall, by petition presented to the City Council before the adoption of an ordinance declaring the same, agree upon a different kind of an improvement, the estimate of the cost thereof and the specifications of the same shall be made upon the basis of the character of the improvement so selected, and the City Council reserves the right to designate a different kind of an improvement if the property owners so direct, as above specified.

That written remonstrances and objections to said proposed improvement may be made and filed with the Recorder of said City at any time before 8 o'clock P. M. on July 27th, 1925.

A motion was made and duly seconded that the resolution be adopted. The motion carried unanimously and the resolution was thereupon declared adopted and the Recorder was authorized to cause the resolution to be posted, printed and published, according to the requirements of the City Charter.

The following resolution was then introduced and read:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE.

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Sherwood, Washington County, Oregon, deems it expedient and purposes to improve Main Street in said City, from the northwesterly line of First Street to the southeasterly line of Third Street, with street intersection at Main and Second Streets, such improvement to be made and done in the following manner, to wit:

By bringing the surface of said portion of Main Street to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway, and said street intersection, with macadam pavement of an approximate thickness of 0.7 feet, said pavement to be 26 feet wide except at street intersections, laying and constructing concrete curb, (except where curb is already constructed), driveways, concrete cornerstones at driveways, providing suitable drainage, and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement, said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of said City, and at an estimated cost of \$2012.00.

But if the owners of 75% of the property affected by this improvement, and upon which assessments will be levied to pay for the same, shall, by petition presented to the City Council before the adoption of an ordinance declaring the same, agree upon a different kind of an improvement, the estimate of the cost thereof and the specifications for the same shall be made upon the basis of the character of the improvement so selected, and the City Council reserves the right to designate a different kind of an improvement if the property owners so direct, as above specified.

That written objections and remonstrances to said proposed improvement may be made and filed with the Recorder of said City at any time before 8 o'clock P. M. on July 27th, 1925.

A motion was made and duly seconded that the resolution be adopted. The motion carried unanimously and the resolution was thereupon declared adopted and the Recorder was authorized to cause the resolution to be posted, printed and published according to the requirements of the City Charter.

The following resolution was then introduced and read:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE.

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Sherwood, Washington County, Oregon, deems it expedient and purposes to improve Third Street, in said City, from the southwesterly line (extended northwesterly) of Pine Street to the southwesterly line (extended northwesterly) of Main Street, together with street intersections to the property line at Washington Street and at Main Street, such improvement to be made and done in the following manner, to wit:

By bringing the surface of said portion of said street to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway and intersections with macadam pavement of an approximate thickness of 0.7 feet, said pavement to be 26 feet wide, except at intersections, laying and constructing concrete curb (except where curb is already constructed), driveways, concrete cornerstones at driveways, providing suitable drainage, and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement, said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of said City, and at an estimated cost of \$1306.00.

But if the owners of 75% of the property affected by this improvement, and upon which assessments will be levied to pay for the same, shall, by petition presented to the City Council before the adoption of an ordinance declaring the same, agree upon a different kind of an improvement, the estimate of the cost thereof and the specifications of the same shall be made upon the basis of the character of the improvement so selected, and the City Council reserves the right to designate a different kind of an improvement, if the property owners so direct, as above specified.

That written objections and remonstrances to said proposed improvement may be made and filed with the Recorder of said City at any time before 8 o'clock P.M. on July 27th, 1925.

A motion was made and duly seconded that the resolution be adopted. The motion carried unanimously and the resolution was thereupon declared adopted and the Recorder was authorized to cause the resolution to be posted, printed and published according to the requirements of the City Charter.

The following resolution was then introduced and read:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE.

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Sherwood, Washington County, Oregon, deems it expedient and purposes to improve First Street from the southwesterly line of Main Street to the northeasterly line of Park Street, all in the said City of Sherwood, Oregon, such improvement to be made and done in the following manner, to wit:

By bringing the surface of said portion of said street to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway with macadam pavement 26 feet wide and of an approximate thickness of 0.7 feet, laying and constructing concrete curb (except where curb is already constructed), driveways, concrete cornerstones at driveways, providing suitable drainage, and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement, said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of said City, and at an estimated cost of \$1306.00.

But if the owners of 75% of the property affected by this improvement, and upon which assessments will be levied to pay for the same, shall, by petition presented to the City Council before the adoption of an ordinance declaring the same, agree upon a different kind of an improvement, the estimate of the cost thereof and the specifications of the same shall be made upon the basis of the character of the improvement so selected, and the City Council reserves the right to designate a different kind of an improvement if the property owners so direct, as above specified.

That written objections and remonstrances to said proposed improvement may be made and filed with the Recorder of said City at any time before 8 o'clock P.M. on July 27th, 1925.

A motion was made and duly seconded that the resolution be adopted. The motion carried unanimously and the resolution was thereupon declared adopted and the Recorder was authorized to cause the resolution to be posted, printed and published according to the requirements of the City Charter.

The following resolution was then introduced and read:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE.

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Sherwood, Washington County, Oregon, deems it expedient and purposes to improve Park Street from the northwesterly line of Railroad Street to the northwesterly line extended of Second Street, with street intersection at First Street, all in the City of Sherwood, Oregon, such improvement to be made and done in

the following manner, to wit:

By bringing the surface of said portion of Park Street to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway with macadam pavement 26 feet wide, paving the street intersection at First Street, all of said pavement to be of an approximate thickness of 0.7 feet, laying and constructing concrete curb (except where curb is already constructed), driveways, concrete cornerstones at driveways, providing suitable drainage, and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement, said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of said City, and at an estimated cost of \$2012.00.

But if the owners of 75% of the property affected by this improvement, and upon which assessments will be levied to pay for the same, shall, by petition presented to the City Council before the adoption of an ordinance declaring the same, agree upon a different kind of an improvement, the estimate of the cost thereof and the specifications of the same shall be made on the basis of the character of the improvement so selected, and the City Council reserves the right to designate a different kind of an improvement if the property owners so direct, as above specified.

That written objections and remonstrances to said proposed improvement may be made and filed with the Recorder of said City at any time before 8 o'clock P. M. on July 27th, 1925.

A motion was made and duly seconded that the resolution be adopted. The motion carried unanimously and the resolution was thereupon declared adopted and the Recorder was authorized to cause the resolution to be posted, printed, and published according to the requirements of the City Charter.

The following resolution was then introduced and read:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE.

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Sherwood, Washington County, Oregon, deems it expedient and purposes to improve Second Street, from the northeasterly line of Main Street to the southerly line of the tract of land formerly known as the John Smith Tract, said line being also the northerly boundry line of Smock Addition to Sherwood, all in the said City of Sherwood, Oregon, such improvement to be made and done in the following manner, to wit:

By bringing the surface of said portion of said Second Street to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway with macadam pavement 26 feet wide, and of an approximate thickness of 0.7 feet paving all street intersections in line of such pavement, except Pine Street, with the same material, and to the same approximate thickness, laying and constructing concrete curb (except where curb is already constructed), driveways, concrete cornerstones at driveways, providing suitable drainage, and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement, said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of said City, and at an estimated cost of \$2470.00.

But if the owners of 75% of the property affected by this improvement, and upon which assessments will be levied to pay for the same, shall, by petition presented to the City Council before the adoption of an ordinance declaring the same, agree upon a different kind of an improvement, the estimate of the cost thereof and the specifications of the same shall be made upon the basis of the character of the improvement so selected, and the City Council reserves the right to designate a different kind of an improvement if the property owners so direct, as above specified.

That written objections and remonstrances to said proposed improvement may be made and filed with the Recorder of said City at any time before 8 o'clock P. M. on July 27th, 1925.

A motion was made and duly seconded that the resolution be adopted. The motion carried unanimously and the resolution was thereupon declared adopted and the Recorder was authorized to cause the resolution to be posted, printed and published according to the requirements of the City Charter.

No further business appearing at this time the Council moved to adjourn subject to the call of the Mayor.
