The City Council of the City of Sherwood, Oregon, met in regular session with Mayor Morback presiding. Upon roll call all members of the council were found to be present.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the ordinance was ordered read a first time by sections and in full. The motion unanimously carried and the ordinance was then read a first time by sections and in full. A motion was then made and seconded that the rules be suspended and the ordinance be read a second time by title only. The roll was calle upon the motion and the vote stood, Ayes, Snyder, Lawrenz, Young, Swope. Mays, None. So the motion was adopted and the ordinance was then read a second time by title only. A motion was then made that the ordinance be read a third time by sections and in full. The motion was duly seconded and unanimously carried and the ordinance was then read a third time by sections and in full. A motion was then made and seconded that the ordinance do now pass. The roll was called upon the motion and the vote stood, Ayes, Snyder, Lawrenz, Young, Swope. Mays. None. So the ordinance was declared duly passed was numbered 77 and ordered enrolled.

The following resolution was then introduced and read!-

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE.

Oregon, deems it expedient and purposes to improve Pine Street, in said City, from the southeasterly line of Third Street to the northwesterly line of the right-of-way of the S.P.Railroad, together with all street intersections therein, all in said City, such improvement to be made and done in the following manner, to-wit:

By bringing the surface of said portion of Pine Street to the proper subgrade, paving the roadway with Portland cement concrete pavement 20 feet wide and of an approximate thickness of six inches, providing suitable drainage, and by doing such other improvement work as will make a proper and appropriate improvement, said improvement to be made in accordance with the Charter and ordinances of said City, and at an estimated cost of \$5,216.00.

But if the owners of 75% of the property affected by this improvement, and upon which assessments will be levied to pay for the same, shall, by petition presented to the City Council before the adoption of an ordinance declaring the same, agree upon a different kind of improvement, the estimate of the cost thereof and the specifications for the same shall be made upon the basis of the character of the improvement so selected, and the City Council reserves the right to designate a different kind of an improvement if the property owners so direct, as above specified.

Written objections and remonstrances to said proposed improvement may be made and filed with the Recorder of said City at any time

before 8 o'clock P. M. on August 21, 1925.

the metion was declared passed and the City Engineer and Recorder were ordered to cause the resolution to be posted, printed and published according to the requirements of the City Charter.

The Council then discussed the bids on the street improvement work which had been opened. A motion was made and seconded that the bid of The Andrews Construction Company be adjudged the winning bid and that the Mayor and Recorder of the City be authorized to enter into a contract with the said Andrews Construction Company, on behalf of said City of Sherwood, Oregon, for the construction and completion of aforesaid improvements after the pest filing of a sufficient and satisfactory surety bond with the said Mayor and said Recorder. The motion was unanimously adopted.

No further business appearing the Council adjourned subject

to the call of the Mayor.
