

Sherwood, Oregon, March 14, 1930.

The Sherwood City Council met pursuant to adjournment with Mayor Morback presiding and Councilmen Lawrenz, Shaffer and Muralt present.

This being the time set to take action with the Telephone Company over a franchise that matter was taken up.

An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance granting the West Coast Telephone Company, its successors and assigns, a right to erect, maintain, and operate in the City of Sherwood, Oregon, and in or under the streets, avenues, and alleys thereof; poles, wires and other appliances and conductors for transmission of electricity for telephone and telegraph purposes; such wires and conductors may be strung on other fixtures above ground or laid under ground in pipes or conduits or otherwise protected, and such other apparatus may be used as necessary or proper to maintain the same." was introduced.

It was moved and seconded that the Ordinance be read a first time by sections and in full. Motion carried and the Ordinance read in full.

It was moved and seconded that the rules be suspended and the Ordinance read a second time by title only. The roll was called upon the motion and the vote stood: Ayes, Lawrenz, Shaffer, Muralt. Nays, None. Motion carried and the Ordinance read a second time by title only.

A motion was made and seconded that the Ordinance be read a third time by sections and in full and placed upon its final passage. Motion carried and the Ordinance was read a third time by sections and in full.

A motion was made and seconded that the Ordinance do now pass. The roll was called upon the motion and the vote stood: Ayes, Lawrenz, Shaffer, Muralt. Nays, None. So the motion carried and the Ordinance was declared duly adopted and ordered enrolled and numbered 109.

A motion was then made and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.
