

Sherwood, Oregon, November 24, 1930.

The Sherwood City Council met in special session with Mayor Morback presiding and all Councilmen answering roll call.

This being the time set for hearing of objections to the proposed budget and amount to be raised by general taxation for the general fund of the City of Sherwood for the year 1931, that matter was taken up. And no objections having been filed and no one present objecting to the proposed budget as read, an Ordinance was introduced authorizing the levying board of the City of Sherwood, Oregon, to raise the sum of \$3000.00 by a general tax on all taxable property within the City of Sherwood, Oregon.

A motion was made that the Ordinance be read a first time by sections and in full. The motion was seconded and passed, so the Ordinance was read a first time in full.

Another motion was made and seconded that the rules be suspended and the Ordinance read a second time by title only. The rules were called upon the motion and the vote stood: Ayes, Snyder, Lawrenz, Shaffer, and Muralt. Nays, None. So the motion carried and the Ordinance was then read a second time by title only.

A motion was then made and seconded that the Ordinance be read a third time by sections and in full and placed upon its final passage. The motion carried by unanimous vote and the Ordinance was read.

A motion was made and seconded that the Ordinance do now pass. The roll was called upon the motion and the vote stood: Ayes, Snyder, Lawrenz, Shaffer, and Muralt. Nays, None. So the Ordinance was declared duly adopted, numbered 110, and ordered enrolled.

No further business appearing the Council adjourned subject to call of the Mayor.
