An Ordinance was then introduced entitled "An Ordinance regulating the loading and unloading, or parking of railroad cars, and prohibiting blocking or obstructing of certain streets; providing penalties for the violation thereof; repealing Ordinance No. 19 of the City of Sherwood and declaring an emergency".

A motion was made and seconded that the ordinance be read a first time by sections and in full. The motion was carried by unanimous vote and the ordinance read.

A motion was then made and seconded that the ordinance be read a second time by title only. The roll was called upon the motion and the vote stood: Ayes, Shaffer, Muralt, Cunningham and Lawrenz. Nays, None. So the ordinance was read a second time by title only and seconded.

A motion was then made that the ordinance be read a third time and placed upon its final passage. The motion was adopted by unanimous vote and the ordinance read a third time by sections and in full.

A motion was made and seconded that the ordinance do now pass. The roll was called upon this motion and the vote stood: Ayes, Shaffer, Muralt, Cunningham and Lawrenz. Nays, None. So the ordinance was declared duly passed and numbered 117 and ordered enrolled.

No other business appearing before the Council that body adjourned in regular form.
