MEETING NOTES

- 1. Call to Order/Roll Call (Boughey)
 - 6:34pm
- 2. Adjustments to the Agenda (Boughey)
 - Agenda approved as presented
- 3. Approval of June Minutes (Boughey)

Beasley motion to approve the June minutes. Second by Boughey. All in favor; motion passed.

4. Center for the Arts Program Update (Chapin)

- Missoula Children's Theatre sessions are full Peter & Wendy Aug 8-13 still looking for one homestay. Need volunteers on Aug 13th for the show (popcorn sales for the Friends.)
- Exceeding expectations for summer camp Leah Burgess is doing an incredible job programming classes.
- Family Matinee Series is being programmed.
 - o Tears of Joy will be performing two shows with field trips during the week.
 - o Portland Taiko will perform in March.
- Gallery: the Photography challenge is now open and will be up through October
 - o Four Eights is next canvas pickup is in August.
 - It was asked if the Center for the Arts gets a cut of gallery sales. Chapin explained that the Center gets 30%

- o In 2017 Makers5 will cut back to curating 3 shows vs the full season.
- Rentals Two productions, three concerts and lots of competition for the weekends this fall
 - CYT is in the process of booking 2 more shows and a benefit performance.
 (WOW!)
 - o Full Draw Film Festival was successful; selling out the Main Hall
 - o New rental rates are opening some doors for new performance groups
 - o Ongoing Rentals are about to open up
 - It was asked if City Staff is responsible for the cleaning of the building after rentals. Chapin explained that the city has a contracted janitorial company and renters are required to spot clean after their rental.
- Outdoor events are going strong

5. Cultural Arts Walking Tour Update (Switzer/Beilstein)

- Switzer reported that stop descriptions have been sent to June Reynolds and Sea Reach for proofing. Switzer also requested that the Cultural Arts Commission members look over descriptions and send any changes into Beilstein by the end of the week.
- The next step in the project will be to design trail markers.
- Switzer expressed interest in adding technology in the future phases of the project; QR code for extended stories and photo overlays.

6. Community Arts Outreach (Chapin)

- Art Walk September 15 meeting will be soon
- Library Summer reading performances in the main hall have had a great draw
 - It was asked if there has been an issue with parking for events. Chapin explained that there have been no problems.
- Center for the Arts is putting on crafts at 4 Bilingual Storytelling events in the park
- Center for the Arts will have a table at all Music on the Green and Movies in the Park events.

7. Vision Discussion (Boughey/Chapin)

- Chapin proposed that the Commission take one area of focus, per meeting, from the June retreat to concentrate on and do a SWOT analysis on.

9. Council Update (Harris via Boughey)

- The Council is currently discussing the following:
 - o A stipend for council; \$250 for councilors and \$500 for Mayor
 - Change the City Recorders reporting from Council to City Manager
 - Remove the world "annual" from the charger with regard to the Budget; allowing flexibility in the future in case the City ever wants to move to a two year budget cycle.
