4. Guest Speaker: Cristina Caravaca - Public Art

Caravaca presented a Power Point presentation (see Exhibit A)

- It was asked how much it costs to install public art. Caravaca explained that it can differ greatly for each piece. Caravaca estimated that the infrastructure for the piece shown cost about \$10,000 or more and explained that the footing has to be replaced for every new art piece.
- It was asked what City departments Caravaca has to work with when installing public art. Caravaca explained that she works with Maintenance, Parks & Recreation, Public Works, Transportation, Risk & Liability, Facilities Crew, and Planning (for larger pieces).

- Kuiper shared the Hillsboro 2020 plan with the group; vision action plan. She
  encouraged the Commission members to look over the plan and see how it
  influenced the Public Art program.
- It was asked how long it took Hillsboro to create their Public Art Master Plan.
   Caravaca stated that it took Hillsboro about a year and a half to complete and \$60,000.
