MEETING NOTES

1. Call to Order/Roll Call (Sims)

Called to order at 6:35pm Visitor- Matthew Schantin

- 2. Adjustments to the Agenda (Sims)
 - None
- 3. Approval of February Minutes (Sims)
 - Boughey motioned to approve the February minutes. Seconded by Blackwood. All in favor, motion passed.

4. Sherwood Sheep Update (Sims)

Sims announced that he will be picking up 20 sheep from Hillsboro on Friday. Hall had sent a signed contract to the City of Hillsboro. Sims reviewed the project schedule (Exhibit A).

- A question was raised about the replacement value of the sheep. Sims explained that each sheep is valued at \$100 and the mother ewe is valued at \$1,000.
- It was asked what the lead Commissioner's responsibilities are for each event. Sims stated the following:
 - o Contact key person—ask them if there is an ideal time to setup
 - o Plan the photo shoot
 - o Pick the camera that will be used
 - Coordinate with Geof to pick-up sheep
 - o Execute the event—encourage people to interact with the sheep
 - o Send picture and post to Center for the Arts staff in a group text

- o Stay until the end of the event and take care of the sheep.
- It was asked if the support person needs to be a Commissioner. Sims stated that they do not; they can be a volunteer.
- It was asked if the Commissioners should ask the event/location's main contact if they have suggestions for the photoshoot. Hall suggested that the Commissioner go in with a plan so the location contacts don't feel burdened with additional work.
- It was asked if the Commission should ask the community to come up with other ways to interact with the sheep. Hall reminded the Commission that during the last meeting the Commission discussed doing a few events really well, leaving it to the Commission to lead.
- It was asked if there will be a final wrap-up photoshoot at the end of the project. Sims suggested the Commission come to the next meeting with some ideas.
- It was suggested to do a "behind the scenes" story on Instagram with the set-up, pick-up, and transportation of the sheep.
- It was asked if Commissioners working each event should send pictures and video to post on social media as it is happening. Hall confirmed that they should.
- Sims will e-mail a "why statement," and information about the sheep to use at events on Wednesday.

5. Friends of the Center for the Arts Update (Boughey)

Boughey provided the following updates:

- The Friends are busy planning the 2019 Gala—all vendors have been selected, Jen Harlow-Smith will be doing a live painting, Friends are working on decorations, and procurement.
- The Friends have awarded Production Assistance to CYT for *Elf*, VPA for *The Lion King Jr*, and SFA for *Annie*. Two of the three productions will also bring student field trips to the Center for the Arts.

6. Center for the Arts Update (Hall)

Hall provided the following updates:

- Sherwood High School is currently in the building with their production of Newsies.
- The Center is in the middle of the Family Matinee Series—220 people attended Murray Irish this past Sunday and the next performance will be OBT2 on April 13th.
- Half day and full day summer camps will be held at the Center this summer.
 - o It was asked if there will be any ukulele classes. Hall confirmed that there is a guitar teacher who leads both small group guitar and it includes ukuleles.
- The Center is booked solid with rentals in the upcoming months.
- CYT just finished *Peter Pan*—in the course of one field trip day, 900 people came through the building, which is a record for the Center.

7. Public Art Master Plan Update (Sims/Hall)

Hall announced that she is working with Chapin on the language of the master plan to capture the excitement of the Commission and the solid statistics and research that was provided by Bill Flood.

- Hall presented a proposed lay-out (Exhibit B)
- Hall stated that Sherwood is one of the only Washington County cities without a public art master plan.
- It was stated that the plan should be a living document that can grow with Sherwood.

8. Arts Commission Retreat Planning (Sims)

Simms announced that there will be a Cultural Arts Commission Visioning Retreat at Bella Madrona on June 17 at 4:00pm.

9. Council Update (Garland)

Garland provided the following Council updates:

- \$100,000 was awarded through the CEP Grant—the recipients included the SFA for microphones, the Robin Hood Festival, and VPA for an after-school music theory program.
- Council will be discussing accessory dwelling units (ADUs) at the next meeting.
- The Parks Board is updating the Parks Master Plan.
- Council has authorized Joe Gall to move forward with the construction of the Skate Park.
- Sherwood Foundation for the Arts' puzzle tournament was covered by the Oregonian and it went viral.
